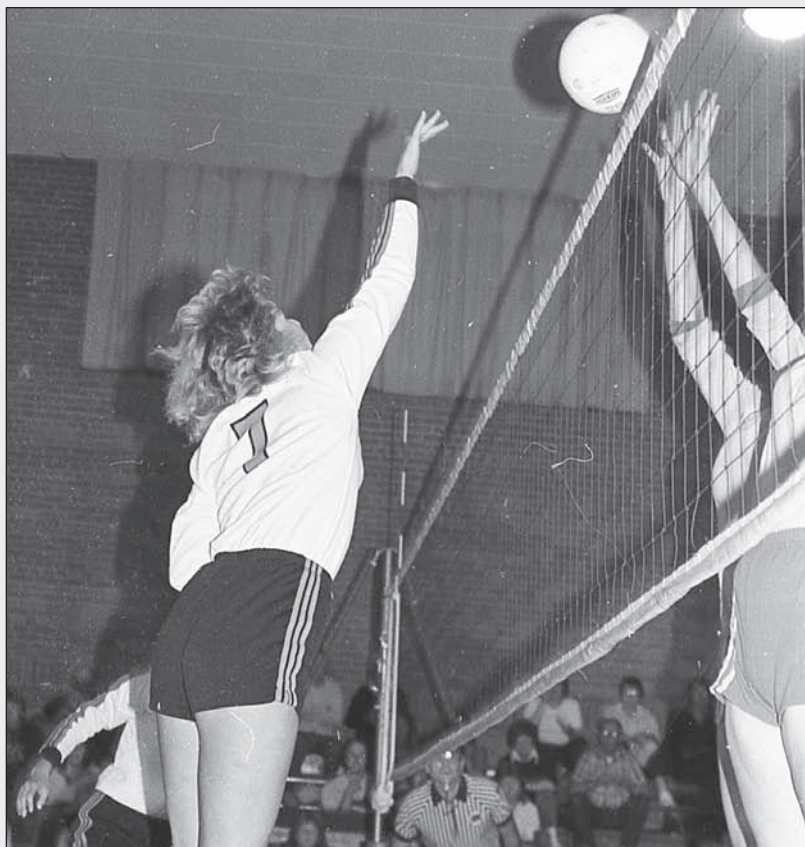

One hundred years ago The Ritzville Times **October 7, 1909**

Seventy-five years ago Ritzville Journal-Times **Oct. 11, 1934**
