### *One hundred years ago* The Ritzville Times November 11, 1909

The contractor expects to start the brick work on the new Ralston school house this week – that is, if it quits raining.

G. Voltz is enlarging the Washtucna post office building by taking out a partition and using the room formerly occupied by Mrs. Loucks' millinery store in addition to the one now being used. He is adding a section of new lock boxes also, and re-arranging all the fixtures.

Women may enter any saloon in Wallace, Idaho, whenever so disposed, provided they go for the same purpose that men would enter the saloon, according to a decision given by Judge Woods in the district court.

### *Seventy-five years ago* Ritzville Journal-Times November 15, 1934

A.C. Rummer, manager of the J.C. Penney Co., was stricken with a severe heart attack Monday night at his home, but his condition is improving.
